## Once in Zaragoza

### Zaragoza Airport – Zaragoza Centre

The **buses** running between the airport and the city centre depart every half an hour. The journey takes between 45 minutes and a single ticket costs €1,70.

Departures:

Monday to Saturday every 30 minutes from Paseo María Agustín, 7

- Services Zaragoza - Airport: from 05:30 to 22:30
- Services Airport - Zaragoza: from 06:15 to 23:15

Sundays and public holidays hourly from Paseo María Agustín, 7

- Services Zaragoza - Airport: from 05:30 to 22:00. Special service at 22:45
- Services Airport - Zaragoza: from 06:15 to 22:45. Special service at 23:15

If you are in a rush and you prefer to take a taxi, taxis are available at the airport, close to the Arrivals Gate. The price is approx. €25,00.
